Annual Inspections

Annual Inspections will begin in March and last until November/December depending on the weather. Reminder letters will be sent to properties which require maintenance and/or appear to have unapproved or unacceptable exterior changes. We would appreciate everyone's understanding of why such inspections are necessary in a homeowner's association, and we ask for your prompt compliance with any issues that are brought to your attention.

Types of things that we will be looking for are as follows: trim that has peeling paint, rotten wood, pressure washing, missing or damaged roof shingles, and other standard maintenance items. Generally if you see peeling paint or wood exposed, it is time to paint. Secure your contractors early as they start to book up in March as other communities are also conducting their annual inspections.

Architectural changes that have not been approved by the Architectural Review Committee will require an application to be filed. Any new exterior modification or addition requires an application. We appreciate owners who submit their applications before making a change! If you receive a letter about a change, please fill out an application and return it with a copy of your property plat, a description of the change and a picture, diagram or drawing. The more information you provide the better!

Again, we appreciate your understanding of the importance of these annual inspections. The rules and regulations that you signed when you purchased your house were put in place to help you, your neighbors and the community as a whole prosper from your investment. We are all in this together! So, please do your part and help keep your property looking great!

Notice from American Disposal Services

As a reminder, please be advised that removal of ferrous metals/white goods such as stoves, washers, dryers, hot water tanks and other bulky metallic items will need to be called into the office of American Disposal Services (ADS) 24 hours in advance for scheduling. Refrigerators, freezers and air conditioning units must have refrigerants removed and tagged by a certified technician before they are collected. There is an additional charge to the homeowner for removal of these items. Special pickups such as furniture, mattresses and other non-metallic household items are collected on the second pickup day of the week (Friday).

White goods are taken to a separate disposal site where they are recycled. Keep in mind recycling white goods is environmentally friendly. Recycling these items conserves energy, natural resources and reduces air and water pollution.

Garbage should be put in secure receptacles and then placed out at curbside in front of your home either very early in the morning on pick up days (Tuesdays & Fridays) or after dark the evening before.
